







pCODR - Request for Advice:

CKCis Real World Evidence (RWE)

 April 2017, Provincial Advisory Group (PAG) submitted a RFA to pCODR regarding the (March 2013) Final Recommendation (re axitinib):

Is there evidence to fund axitinib as an alternative to everolimus for the second-line treatment of metastatic clear cell renal carcinoma?

CKCis investigators made the RFA question a research priority






The Future
